<p>I understand the obligations under the Animal Welfare Act of persons in charge of animal to ensure that their physical and health needs are met, with good practice defined in Codes of welfare under the act.</p>								
<p>I/We declare that as the supplier of calves intended for human food, this Bobby Calf Status Declaration is true and accurate, and that I have read, understood and agree that I must abide by the requirements set out in this form.</p> <p>Unless I advise Greenlea Premier Meats of any change prior to 30 November 2017, this declaration will remain valid until that date.</p> <p>Calves suitable for slaughter shall be at least 4 days old, milk fed only and not more than 2 months old.</p> <p>1- I/We agree to abide strictly by the Code of Welfare for Dairy Cattle, Transport Code of Welfare (re selection of calves for transport) and Animal Welfare (Calves) Regulations 2016 as required by the Ministry for Primary Industries (MPI).</p> <p>2 - I/We agree to feed the calves within 2 hours of the notified* pick up.</p> <p>3 - I/We agree to record the time of last feed.</p> <p>4 - I/we agree to hold these records in a secure place for a period of 2 years for assessment purposes.</p> <p>*for the avoidance of confusion the notified pick time is agreed between processor, transporter and supplier at the start of the 2017 bobby calf season.</p> <p>I/We acknowledge these tags remain the property of Greenlea Premier Meats Ltd and will only be used for the identification of bobby calves for supply to Greenlea Premier Meats Ltd.</p>								
<p>1) Calves treated directly with any antimicrobial agent (e.g. antibiotic or sulphur drugs) or fed a medicated milk replacer containing any medication must not be submitted for slaughter. Treatment with an approved electrolytic solution, which contains no medication, is permitted</p> <p>2) Where a pregnant cow has been treated with any animal remedy and calves before the meat withholding period of the product has elapsed, then the calf may not be submitted for slaughter until the cow becomes eligible for slaughter. NOTE: CALVES BORN TO COWS TREATED WITH BUPARVAQUONE FOR THEILERIA ARE NOT ELIGIBLE FOR SLAUGHTER.</p> <p>3) Calves may be indirectly exposed to chemical residues if they are fed milk from a treated cow. If calves are exposed to any chemical via cow milk, they are not fit for slaughter until after the expiry of the meat withholding period of the cow providing milk.</p> <p>4) When animals at slaughter are found to exceed the permissible limit for any animal remedy, pesticide or other contaminant, MPI will place the risk source farm under movement control. This prevents the movement of animals off the farm without a MPI permit. In cases where a farm is placed under movement control after the supplier has supplied a seasonal declaration to the slaughter facility a new seasonal declaration must be submitted.</p> <p>5) Johnes's Vaccination: If you do not know the Johnes's disease vaccination of any animal, you must circle "YES"</p> <p>6) TB Movement Control: This requirement relates to the TB status of your FARM and NOT a TB movement control AREA and allows us to send product to Russia. Please notify us immediately if the status of your farm changes during the bobby calf season.</p>
